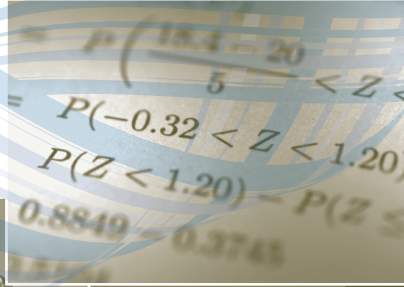

Course materials include three texts, a CD-ROM (PC) that simulates test environment and scoring, and supplemental handouts. Tuition includes cost of materials.

GRE Prep

Learn question types, advanced test-taking strategies, common test items, timing, and the most efficient ways to solve problems for the Graduate Records Examinations (GRE). The GRE General Test contains verbal and quantitative sections and two mandatory essays. Course materials include three texts, a CD-ROM (PC) that simulates test environment and scoring, vocabulary cards, and supplemental handouts. Tuition includes cost of materials.

LSAT Prep

Prepare for the Law School Admissions Test (LSAT) by learning test-taking strategies and practicing the various types of questions found on the LSAT exam. Learn proven methods for dealing with each question type (logical reasoning, analytical reasoning, reading comprehension, and essay), and gain confidence in your test-taking abilities by applying strategies in test-simulation exercises. Course materials include textbook, "retired" tests and explanations, and a CD-ROM (PC) that simulates test environment and scoring. Tuition includes cost of materials.

Online GRE & GMAT Prep

Take up to four months from the time you register to complete a self-directed Web-based course. The class covers various types of verbal and quantitative questions presented on the GRE and the GMAT.

After registration you will receive course materials as well as a password to access the Web-based course. The password will be valid for four months and tuition includes cost of materials.

TOEFL Prep

Learn important test-taking skills in preparation for taking the internet-based Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL iBT) through intensive review of the four skills assessed on this exam: reading, written expression, listening, and speaking.

While this course focuses on the TOEFL (iBT), the test-taking skills and language review covered in this course would also be useful if you are preparing to take the paper-based TOEFL, IELTS, or MELAB exams. The TOEFL Prep Course is offered through the Minnesota English Language Program.

Grad School Test Prep - Classroom Course Refund Policy
